Swabodhini School and Vocational centre for Special children, established in 1989, is a nonresidential school with about 55+ students, having 2 branches in Thiruvanmiyur and Velachery, Chennai. Swabodhini Charitable Trust wholly manages the special school and the vocational training centre and is recognized by the Tamil Nadu State Government.

We impart Functional Academics, Therapy services (Occupational and Speech), Physical fitness (Yoga, Fitness and Dance), Life Skills and Vocational skills to students with Autism and related challenges so that they can adapt themselves to the varying day to day requirements. Swabodhini aims to transform the lives of individuals with autism to be contributing members of their family and society.


We have won the winner shield at 34th Rota Talent Contest

Primary classes have students from ages 5 to 14. They are taught basic language and arithmetic skills.Primary students graduate into the pre vocational classes and here, they are assessed based on their aptitude to learn various life skills and put into different streams. The prevocational students from age 14 to 18 are given preparatory training for vocational skills. Students who successfully complete the pre vocational training now start their vocational training.

We have an IEP Individualised Education Plan for each child. IEP is divided into two main divisions: Functional academics and Life skills.



Student strength

We have workbooks based on the student's need. They use both online interactive worksheets and offline reusable **interactive worksheets**.





We provide life skill training such as crossing residential intersections, shopping and communication skills. .





Art therapy helps to express the student's emotion and also act a stressbuster





We have included the **motor skills** in curriculum to improve their fine motor skills





Counselling helps to create self-awareness, self-confidence and to increase their emotional strength.



Activities of Daily Living are an important skill for every special child to lead their lives independently. We train our students in activities like brushing, buttoning shirts, etc.





Vocational Skill Training

Our 1-year Vocational Courses in Retail skills, Culinary Skills and Computer Skills are accredited by Guru Nanak College and the students receive their certificates from Guru Nanak College (Autonomous) on successful course completion. For those students who have an aptitude for art and aesthetics, and for those where open employment and internship is a challenge, we actively train them in making vocational products like decorative diyas, paper bags etc, and we take corporate orders and bulk orders for the same.



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Vocational Skill Training

Weaving Unit

This year we have introduced weaving as part of their curriculum. Weaving helps the students to improve their gross & fine motor skills. It also helps them to reduce anxiety and improves self-esteem.



In culinary skills, we also train our students in baking cookies, cupcakes and chocolates









Our students are trained in making paper bags,hand painted diyas and beaded jewelries. We set up stalls at corporates and events.We also take bulk orders of these vocational products.

Assisted employment Initiative-Grundfos



We inaugurated our new assisted employment initiative "Popcause" partnering with Advantage foods Pvt. Ltd. in association with Grundfos Pumps India Pvt. Ltd. This popcorn manufacturing unit provides in-house employment for individuals with special needs.





Community Outreach Program

Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, Government of Tamil Nadu conducted an Assessment Camp for Kids with Special Needs, in association with BumbleB Trust's Kalvi40 and RAMCO Cements. The event was launched by Mr.K.Vijaya Bhaskar (District Adi Dravidar Welfare Officer, Ariyalur). We have partnered with BumbleB Trust's Kalvi40 team for their community based rehabilitation program to assess children with special needs in rural areas.
